FOR ALL CONDITIONS THAT ARE LIFE-OR LIMB- THREATENING, GO TO THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT.

URGENT CARE

Abdominal pain
Allergic reaction, mild

Rash
Skin infection
Simple laceration
Sinus infection

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

Abdominal pain, severe and prolonged
Allergic reaction, severe
Animal bite, severe or extensive
Bleeding that will not stop
Burn, serious or severe
Fainting, with prolonged recovery / disorientation
Fever in infants under 8 weeks old
Head injury with loss of consciousness or disorientation
Lacerations or cuts, complicated or extensive
Loss or sudden change of vision
Major fracture
Rabies shots
Seizure without previous diagnosis of epilepsy
Snake bite
Spinal injury
Sudden change in mental state
Sudden shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing
